Objectives:

This course aims at presenting Synodality in its various dimensions as a gift to the Church in our days so that this gift can be fruitful in many ways: 1. in strengthening the communion of the local and universal Church; 2. in helping individual Christians to grow in their spiritual lives; 3. in promoting the New Evangelization. The course will thus be a place to study and assimilate Pope Francis' teaching on the subject and to analyze the influences on it and its place in the history of theology.

The contents of this course have a special relevance in light of the Synod on Synodality that will be concluding in Rome this October. It will provide the tools necessary to understand and evaluate the proceedings of this Synod.

Course Outline:

- Understand synodality and its importance as a gift to the Church.
- Know and value Pope Francis' teaching on synodality.
- Critically engage different positions regarding synodality.
- Participate proactively in the synodal dimension of the Church, on a personal and communal level.

Target participants:

• Mature Christian church members, including Catholics and Protestant, who already believe but now want to understand better what and why they believe.

- Completed secondary level education or equivalent

Fr. László was born in Germany and is currently based in Rome, Italy. He is a religious member of the Congregation of the Legionaries of Christ and was ordained to the Catholic priesthood in 2020.

He holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy and a licentiate degree in theology (both from the Pontifical Athenaeum Regina Apostolorum in Rome, Italy), and a master's degree in psychology (from Divine Mercy University in Sterling, Virginia, USA). He is currently pursuing a PhD in dogmatic theology at the Kölner Hochschule für Katholische Theologie in Cologne, Germany. His three main areas of research are the interplay between evangelization and culture, the reception of the theology of Joseph Ratzinger, and the concept of sacramentality studied from an interdisciplinary perspective combining theology and psychology.
